**John 8:12-** Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

#### I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD

We had a STELLAR VBS celebration in July. The kids got together to learn about Jesus' light in the world. Sometimes I think VBS is a great place for adults too! Why, you ask? Well, we get to see our kids soak in the word of God, we see their eyes light up when we connect Jesus to their lives. And the best part is they are reminded of the light they carry to others.

In our sanctuary, you will see the east wall covered with one of the VBS banners and stars around the banner that represent the kids' God sightings they were encouraged to look for. In our baptismal calling we are given Christ's light to glorify our God in heaven. What a beautiful way to represent Christ's light in the world by marking their God sightings on stars. Some stars are millions of miles away yet we can see their light, faded or bright. But Christ's light is all around us. It is in creation, in the sun, in you and in me, and in our kids!

We have a Stellar God who has called us each by name to share Christ's light in the world. What are the God sightings you find in your life? How do you share Jesus' light in the world? We talked with our children about how we treat one another and one of the most important ways we do that is to recognize the light we carry and "Shine Jesus' Light" to those around us. What a beautiful world it would be if we looked for Christ's light in one another?!

So as you come to worship, think about how you have seen Christ's light shine in the world and in those around you. Take a moment to acknowledge the good someone has done for you and it does not have to be a grandiose thing. It can be as simple as a compliment of someone's smile or their signing. Compliment our council members who work so hard in leading our church. Compliment a parent who has done the unthinkable, sometimes, in the challenge of getting their family up and to hear the Good News of Jesus in worship with us. Compliment our VBS leaders, helpers, and the "director of chaos," Karie, who put this beautiful reminder together for our children. Finally, compliment our kids for being present and acknowledge the light they bring to us. Our kids need to hear that from us too.

Dear Members and Friends of St. John's,

During this 150th year of St. John's ministry, we've been looking at our "ancestry, our family tree," so to speak.

St. John's has a cemetery. It is located at the end of Memorial Lane, a road to the west off J, just north of the S and J junction. Since the Town of Little Suamico didn't establish Riverside Cemetery until 1878, there was no other place to bury unless interment was done on the home property. St. John's Cemetery was active into the 20th century, until a decision was made to cease burials there and move existing graves to the Riverside Cemetery in the 1940s. There still are some existing graves on the original site so it will always be considered a cemetery. It has returned to nature, but there are flowers there that still bloom, lovingly planted a century ago by families tending their loved ones' graves.

And then there's the name issue: Are we St. John's or St. John? Our first constitution was in German and translated as St. John's Lutheran Church. In 1964, a new constitution was adopted with the name of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church. Then along came Pastor Kilde, with knowledge of German, who convinced us the name should be St. John and St. John was placed on the outside of the new church in 1975. Everything else, including the road sign, said St. John's. When asked, Pastor Zamzow, who lived the German language, said they're both correct! It seems languages in that part of Europe don't have a possessive. It is the farm of Schwartz, not Schwartz's farm. This means we can be the Church of St. John, or St. John's Church; we have chosen St. John's. The letters spelling St. John on the now Fellowship Hall rotted away with time and were removed so we are once again St. John's, everywhere.

A statue of the risen Lord stood on the altar in the little white church for decades, along with a Crucifix. In 1968, the Crucifix and statue of Jesus were replaced with a plain cross, representing the Resurrection. In 1970, at the annual meeting there was "a lengthy discussion" on whether to have the statue of Jesus or the cross on the altar. (It is unknown why both items couldn't be on the altar together.) The cross won by a 21-14 vote. The next mention of the statue is in August 1971, when the congregation voted to elevate the statue on a 6" pedestal. No mention of the date of the statue's return to the altar was found, but it is believed Pr. Kilde moved it after his arrival in late 1970. The statue remained on the altar until our present sanctuary was built and the new altar was free-standing. The statue went into storage again. Multiple fruitless discussions were had about safe placement for display in various areas of the building. This year, the statue is out of the darkness once more in Fellowship Hall, a reminder to shine Jesus' light.
