

Time seems to be flying these days, right? At least it always seems that the holidays come and go so quickly! But this year is especially quick as we will celebrate Ash Wednesday on February 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30. Yes, we will celebrate on St. Valentine's Day. Seems fitting to remember the great love we are given as a gift!

From Miss Karie~

I had the AMAZING opportunity to travel to New Orleans the week of January 16th to attend the ELCA's 2024 Youth Leader Extravaganza Conference. This is my first time attending the annual conference and I would not have been able to go without the TREMENDOUS support of our Brotherhood, who donated \$1000 toward my trip, and an extremely generous congregation member who covered my airline ticket with personal miles. I cannot possibly thank you all enough! And thank you, members of St. John's, for all of your support, encouragement, enthusiasm for our Youth Ministry Programs and for allowing me to be away from the office for the week. I have learned SO much, met SO many wonderful people, connected with an incredible number of resources and look very much forward to putting my new knowledge into action! Here are the Classes/Workshops I attended at the Extravaganza-

I enrolled into a 2 day Intensive Care Course led by a faculty member from Luther Seminary. This class took place on Wednesday and Thursday for a total of 12 hours. The course I chose was "Listening, Experimenting, Discerning: Leading Strategically in Unpredictable Times" and was led by Dr. Terri Elton, Professor of Leadership and Dean of Academic Affairs at Luther. Pastor Stacy attended this class with me which was really cool as we could explore some of the biggest goals and challenges specifically related to St. John's Youth Programs together!

**Course Description:** As ministry challenges become increasingly complex and environmental conditions are less predictable, how do we as ministry leaders plan for the future? In today's world the importance of strategic planning has not changed, yet traditional strategic planning methods were not designed for today's dynamic circumstances. In this course, participants will explore strategic planning practices designed for unpredictable environments. Participants will learn about these practices as they work on their specific ministry challenges.

I also attended numerous workshops throughout the remaining days, in addition to six General Sessions, dinner with Luther Seminary Grads & Faculty and a wonderful lunch with some of our local Synod youth leaders. Some of the workshops I attended were:

- Dream Beyond: Graduation to Campus Rev. Cassandra Lamb, University Lutheran Center Campus Pastor Explore how to best send high school students from congregations to campus ministries. Helping students dream beyond their current faith community and to connect with a LuMin (aka: Lutheran Campus Ministry) site has the potential to set them up for success in the next chapter of their lives. We will also consider how congregations can best stay connected during this transition and launch young people into their "second third" of life. In order to make this dream a reality we need the partnership of congregations and youth ministry professionals to help high school students dream beyond their "right now" to their next step, which just might be a campus.
  - Integrating AI for Effective Youth Ministry Rev. Michael Jannett, Assistant to the Bishop for Formation and Communication in the Southeastern Synod. This workshop is designed to equip youth ministers with practical knowledge on leveraging artificial intelligence (AI) to enhance their mission of making disciples for Jesus. In just

one hour, participants will explore the potential applications of AI in youth ministry and discuss ethical considerations for its responsible use. They will discover how AI can personalize discipleship, provide data-driven insights, optimize resources, and enhance outreach and engagement. Through interactive discussions and real-life case studies, participants will gain a deeper understanding of how AI can support their ministry efforts. The workshop will also provide hands-on guidance, enabling participants to identify AI opportunities, select appropriate tools, and develop an action plan for implementation. By the end of the session, youth ministers will be empowered to integrate AI effectively and take their youth ministry to new heights of impact and relevance.

- The Now and the Not Yet-The Soul of Your Leadership: A Liminal Journey Space Tending to Self and the Institution Dr. Kris Bjorke. You. Leader. Person of Faith. Standing between so many things. Older and younger people. The world as God intends and the world as it is. Connecting. How do you continue to do this work in this day and age? What does it look like? How do you continue to grow? What do you do with your doubts? —So many demands of today's children, youth and family ministers is about managing the multiple demands internally and externally in your life. This workshop is about learning about how to live in liminal space. Liminal comes from the Latin word "limen" meaning threshold. You are neither here nor there, but in a state of inbetween. Let's explore this place together as this is often where we are most teachable and most open to what God has for us. Utilizing the wisdom learned from many other thought leaders including Susan Beaumont, Ruth Haley Barton, Dwight Zscheile, Andy Root and many years of ministry—we will but scratch the surface but hopefully start a conversation that will leave you curious for more.
- 5 Approaches to Developmentally-Appropriate Children's Messages Dawn Rundman, Ph.D. with 1517 Media Children's messages may last only a few minutes, but they deserve careful thought, theological grounding, and creativity. Dawn will present five approaches for writing and delivering children's messages that can connect with all kids. Using storytelling, visuals, movement, and more, participants will practice ways to deliver children's messages that stick with kids (and adults too).
- **Dreaming of Bringing the Mountaintop Home** Taryn Hauglie, Assistant Director of Christikon Ever peak a mountain? If you have, you feel like you're on top of the world. The euphoria, the adrenaline, and the views for miles can be hard to beat. Avid climbers can in time start to experience "peak fever" always chasing that rush they feel when they reach the summit. In a similar way, youth can feel that same mountaintop feeling, whether they attend the Gathering, go to camp, or participate in a service-learning trip. These experiences bring youth up the mountain and closer to God, so how can we bring that mountaintop feeling back home with us after the trip? How can we sustain the community that is built during these monumental experiences in an inclusive way? Where can we find little mountaintops in our own front yard?
- Center Your Dreams Rev. Marc Mohr. A combination of self care and spiritual connectedness with Jesus, this workshop will focus on mandalas. Mandalas start on the outside and move towards the center, this workshop can be great to integrate into your ministry with youth and adults alike. What are your dreams for the youth, what you do in life and how you can move forward in the future? Come and explore the mandala and how your dreams relate to God.

And the best part? I am able to view recorded sessions of the other workshops I am interested in! (Workshops were offered in specific blocks each day, so many difficult choices for in person attendance had to be made! LOL) I cannot wait to continue my learning journey in the weeks ahead!





In the quiet village of Carriveau, Vianne Mauriac says goodbye to her husband, Antoine, as he heads for the Front. She doesn't believe that the Nazis will invade France...but invade they do, in droves of marching soldiers, in caravans of trucks and tanks, in planes that fill the skies and drop bombs upon the innocent. When a German captain requisitions Vianne's home, she and her daughter must live with the enemy or lose everything. Without food or money or hope, as danger escalates all around them, she is forced to make one impossible choice after another to keep her family alive.

Vianne's sister, Isabelle, is a rebellious eighteen-year-old girl, searching for purpose with all the reckless passion of youth. While thousands of Parisians march into the unknown terrors of war, she meets Gäetan, a partisan who believes the French can fight the Nazis from within France, and she falls in love as only the young can...completely. But when he betrays her, Isabelle joins the Resistance and never looks back, risking her life time and again to save others.

With courage, grace and powerful insight, bestselling author Kristin Hannah captures the epic panorama of WWII and illuminates an intimate part of history seldom seen: the women's war. The Nightingale tells the stories of two sisters, separated by years and experience, by ideals, passion and circumstance, each embarking on her own dangerous path toward survival, love, and freedom in German-occupied, war-torn France—a heartbreakingly beautiful novel that celebrates the resilience of the human spirit and the durability of women. It is a novel for everyone, a novel for a lifetime.


