#### Dear Friends,

Our midweek Lent services will reflect on "Senselessness." We will celebrate our midweek worship with pastors from Atonement Lutheran, St. John's Lutheran, Trinity Lutheran, and Good Shepherd, all of Green Bay. Each pastor has chosen their scriptures and hymns of the day and will reflect on the incarnational spirit of Lent and how it breaks apart the "Senselessness" of Jesus' death and resurrection. We know God exists beyond our understanding of time, space and our senses. Confirmation students often have questions, as do we adults, about an understanding of who God is in our lives when we cannot see God, yet we know God is there. God is omnipresent, always present everywhere.

We reflect on our senses, not in a traditional sense, but in the sense of incarnation: balance, time, propriety, space, and loss. This can almost feel abstract to how we understand our senses. Reflect on the sense of our Lenten journey with Jesus to the cross: through his ministry, into Holy Week, and to the resurrection and into heaven. Put yourself in the shoes of the disciples in Jesus' day and consider the context, the setting, to which he was in, and then consider your journey today.

<sup>8</sup>Let me hear of your steadfast love in the morning, for in you I put my trust. Teach me the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul.

<sup>9</sup>Save me, O Lord, from my enemies; I have fled to you for refuge.

<sup>10</sup>Teach me to do your will, for you are my God. Let your good spirit lead me on a level path.

<sup>11</sup>For your name's sake, O Lord, preserve my life. In your righteousness bring me out of trouble.

Psalm 143:8-11

As you journey through Lent and consider your fasting, think of something that you have felt takes too much of your time or does not give you fulfillment. As the journey takes us closer to the cross, consider what you might put in its place that would be pleasing to our Father in heaven. Did you know that Luther prayed so much that beside the bed, in his home, he wore knee marks into his wooden floor?

I have challenged our confirmation students, who will affirm their baptism at our Palm Sunday celebration, to open their Small Catechism to Luther's morning and evening prayer on a daily basis, and to take note how they feel as they do this. It should become just as easy as saying our Lord's Prayer, which we all have done and learned with repetition. In time you will notice a change in how you feel making this part of your daily life. In your prayer, feel and hear God teaching and leading you on a level path. It will change your day and your life.

God be with you as you give, fast, and pray in your Lenten journey.

Dear Members and Friends,

Sesquicentennial: a period of 150 years. (I looked it up: Sesqui- means one and a half.) A big word for a big milestone. And that's what St. John's is celebrating this year on September 24. Preliminary planning has begun. We need help, ideas... we need you! If you are able to lend a hand with the anniversary planning, please tell Pastor, any Council member or the church office.

As we came out of Covid, the total responsibility for counting and depositing the offerings had fallen on our treasurer, which is unfair, but he was a blessing for St. John's. In-person attendance has grown, so the money counter rotation will be restarted. This is good business practice as well as protection for the treasurer's position. If you want to volunteer, please let us know. A schedule will be created. Barb Dorn has offered to be the Counter Coordinator. The goal is to have this in place by mid-March at the latest.

Last year we approved establishing an endowment fund with an initial deposit recommendation of \$75,000 from the parsonage sale. During 2023 budget preparation, this was placed on hold as we, like many churches, wrestled with financial reality. At the February Council meeting it was agreed to invest \$25,000 in the endowment and proceed with cautious optimism on future investments. As we continue to reactivate teams, we are focusing on Outreach (formerly known as Evangelism) and Stewardship. If you would like to know more about, or are interested in serving on these teams, please let us know. Teams that are up and running can always use additional help, too!

Thank you and thank God for all who have said "Here I am, Lord, send me." Your work, time and supportive prayers are greatly appreciated. It is God's people, by His grace, guided by the Holy Spirit, who have kept St. John's alive Generation to Generation.

Please consider assembling a Birthday Cake Box for someone in need. These will be collected during Lent and delivered to local homeless shelters to be distributed.





We will be discussing the book, Death Stalks Door County by Patricia Skalka.

Six deaths mar the holiday mood as summer vacationers enjoy Wisconsin's beautiful Door County peninsula. Murders, or bizarre accidents? Newly hired park ranger Dave Cubiak, a former Chicago homicide detective, assumes the worst but refuses to get involved. Grief-stricken and guilt-ridden over the loss of his wife and daughter, he's had enough of death.

Forced to confront the past, the morose Cubiak moves beyond his own heartache and starts investigating, even as a popular festival draws more people into possible danger. 
