Celebrating 150 Years of St. John's Lutheran Church

Temple Talk given by Janet Francies on Sunday, July 30, 2023

Good Morning!

I was contacted this summer to consider if I would be interested in giving a Temple Talk in a few weeks in honor of St John's 150th year Anniversary

Celebration service on Oct 8,'23. I felt honored and thankful to be asked.

I have been thinking about what to share with you all. I realize it would take hours, because Ray and I and the boys moved from Green Bay to the Sobieski area in the 70's. We soon found a little old white church on Cty J. To our delight the first time we attended a service we were promptly welcomed by a group of guys on the front steps. We often recalled how friendly they were. And it was so thoughtful of Eunice Redlin to send us a bulletin if we missed a Sunday.

To some of you their names will sound very familiar, like Tom Moes, Royce Polfuss, Curt Hansen, Roger Redlin, Dave Zimmerman, Norm Krumrei, and Harry Fleck, to name a few. We soon became members, and our kids made new friends like Dan Polfuss, Desi Hansen, the Redlin and Cahoon kids, Kevin Eparvier, and others.

It wasn't long before my husband, Ray, who was a Pastor/Social Worker, began as the Interim Pastor at St Johns and Oconto. Then I was asked to be the Organist and Choir Director, with Pat Bastian and Betty Stevens assisting me along the way. Ray and I became quite active, sharing our gifts in numerous ways, especially Ray's woodworking skills. We soon felt we were part of this "family."

As Ray's health deteriorated 10 yrs ago, I became his caregiver, and slipped away from my music positions until his passing on 9/19/20. About 2 yrs ago I was requested to return as Organist and to again direct the men's gospel choir, Echoes of Faith, and I admit I was very happy to be back and useful.

We have seen this church evolve into the beautiful structure we have now, through many ups and downs. It is our "home", and we will always feel welcome.

150 YEARS!! WOW!! "Where has the time gone since we first entered the little white church?" A lot of faith kept us going through the ups and downs.

We have many memories of fun things like Halloween parties, church Bowling League, canoe trips, fishing trips, cutting firewood, booyahs, and everyone helping out with repair projects and patiently waiting for the funds for those jobs, and those funds ALWAYS appeared, with Bob Pagel & Royce Polfuss assuring us not to worry.

I will be forever thankful for your kindness, support, and friendship through the years.

This is a <u>resilient congregation</u>, and <u>will continue to be so into the future</u>, with our <u>Pastor to guide us</u>, and with the good <u>Lord always by our side</u>.



Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is officially in Little Suamico!



Each month, DPIL mails a free book to every registered child in an eligible area from their birth until their 5th birthday. With the support of the St. John's community, the 54141 zip code is now a part of the program! While the Dollywood Foundation covers a majority of the expenses, it currently costs the local affiliate \$2.26 per child each month. The July and August noisy offering will help to offset these costs.



Lemon Coffee Cake Shared by Karen Heimerl

- 1/2 c butter or margarine, softened
- 1 c sugar
- 1 c sour cream
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 2 c flour
- 1 1/2 tsp baking powder
- dash of salt

Cream the butter, sugar, sour cream and vanilla. Add eggs. Mix dry ingredients and add to batter. Put half of batter into greased 9x13 pan.

Spread a 22 oz can of lemon pie filling over batter.

Put remainder of batter on top of filling.

Combine the following and sprinkle on top:

- 1/4 c butter or margarine
- 1/2 c flour
- 1/2 c sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 c chopped nuts

Bake at 350 for 45 minutes.






she tells Alix, on the cusp of great changes in her life.

Home-Canned Items Needed For Fall Bazaar

The canning season is here, which means the bazaar is not that far away! The Canned Goods area is a popular stop for the Bazaar shoppers. Needed canned goods are jams, jellies, pickles, fruit sauces, salsa and anything else that can be canned safely. When you're canning, if you can set aside a dozen (or more!) for the Bazaar, it would be appreciated.

Between 50-60 dozen are needed.

To keep the product consistent and safe, here are a few guidelines:

- Use standard canning jars: 8 oz. for jams and jellies, pint and quart for pickles, etc. (brand unimportant).
- Seal with ring/lid (brand unimportant).
- Jars should be filled, i.e., no gap from top of product to bottom of ring.
- Jams, jellies, preserves, etc. should be soft set (jiggles like Jello) or firm set (no
 jiggle). That pesky batch that didn't set can always be sold as a topping!

For product safety use FDA water bath processing guidelines.

The Bazaar canners recycle: empty jars and rings in good condition can be used over and over and help keep costs down. Bring them to church during August and September and the canners will fill them up again.




