Dear Beloved,

Know that I have been praying for each one of you as we journey together this Lenten season. I pray your time in our series of *Everything In Between* has given you pause to reflect on what God is really calling us into in the time of Lent. Calling us into relationship with our God in heaven, our Brother Jesus, and with one another.

Of course, as you know, we are not certain of what Jesus' childhood was like, but this is what I imagine it was. Mary and Joseph knew Jesus had a special journey in life. I believe that although we do not know for certain how old Jesus was when Joseph passed, we know that Jesus experienced grief. The full-hearted pain of losing a father but knowing the love of his earthly father who taught Him the skill of carpentry, of caring for others, how to be a good husband, and how to be a good learner of the Torah. I believe as Jesus was growing up, he knew the love of earthly siblings who would become his partners in ministry. I believe Jesus learned about His Father in heaven from the stories he heard and read as a child and shared as He grew into a wonderful man. Support St. John's Capital Fund Drive for HVAC Needs

Last fall, the Buildings and Grounds team confirmed that the compressor in the rooftop HVAC unit that cools the sanctuary was no longer functioning. As the unit has outlived its 15–20-year life expectancy, the decision was made to replace it. The cost of the replacement is \$40,000.

To fund this project, St. John's is holding a capital campaign for HVAC needs. You can still make a pledge to the HVAC campaign. Pledges must be paid in full by February 28, 2026. Replacement of the unit will not begin until St. John's has the funds in-hand to cover the cost of the project.



Midweek Lent 2025




Notice the emblem you will see throughout Lent and into Easter. Take a moment to reflect before you read on...



Do you see two hands drawing near to one another, yet, not touching? There are so many things that happen "IN BETWEEN." The beauty of our God who "created night and day and everything in between; land and water and everything in between; you and me and everything in between." We humans want to put everything into its place and not explore everything in between us, in between the spaces in our lives, the differences in our lives. The beauty of everything God has called good is also in between. In this series you will be hearing many of Jesus' parables to his disciples and to us. These parables hold nuances, complexity, and many layers of meaning, just like our lives do. It is hard for some of us that want a clear cut, black and white answer. In that thinking or that longing for something simple and easy, we sometimes miss out on meeting God in the "IN BETWEEN." Draw near to one another in a non-linear way of thinking. Be open to what the Spirit might be wanting you or needing you to hear for the sake of your neighbor, for the sake of Jesus' ministry in our community and the world God so loves.




