Risen by Jan Richardson

"He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said." Matthew 28:6 If you are looking for a blessing, do not linger here.

Here is only emptiness, a hollow, a husk, where a blessing used to be.

This blessing was not content in its confinement.

It could not abide its isolation, the unrelenting silence, the pressing stench of death.

So if it is a blessing you seek, open our own mouth.

Fill your lungs with the air this new morning brings and then release it with a cry.

Hear how the blessing breaks forth in your own voice,

how your own lips form every word you never dreamed to say.

See how the blessing circles back again, wanting you to repeat it, but louder,

How it draws you, pulls you, sends you to proclaim its only word:

Risen.

Risen.

Risen.

Today as I write to you, I am reflecting on a funeral, a celebration of life, that is coming to pass. I am thinking about a light that has shown brightly in our midst that many may have forgotten about. I am thinking about the cross and the symbolism of what it is for us mere humans.

I am blessed to sit in holy spaces with families as they prepare to say goodbye to their loved ones or friends as their earthly bodies give way to new life. Lent seems to be such a solemn time in the church but I think we have our periods of dormancy, where new life can grow and take place. But what is that new life?

If we live as people of the cross, we live in the light and darkness of the cross. In Lent, we visualize it as such a place of pain, but then on Easter morning it becomes a reminder of what Jesus overcame to give us new life eternal. We often forget we experience death and loss in our daily lives: the death of a relationship, loss of a job, the loss of a family pet, the death of leaves and flowers, the death of a loved one or friend. In each of these cases, there will be new life: a new relationship, a new job, maybe the love of a new pet, and the bursting forth of buds on trees and flowers and greening grass. Creation at its best.

God has created such beautiful things out of death and the most beautiful thing of all is life eternal. A light that shines in the darkness that the darkness could not overcome it.

As we emerge from the Lenten pilgrimage, from our winter slumber, I pray that you bring all that you have experienced with you. If you gave something up for Lent, do not let that fast end with Easter. Look to the earth that reminds us that life is always about change, new things that come out of great loss. God had a plan when he made the seasons, seasons we are blessed to experience in the Midwest. Yes, I said blessed, even with the snowy weather.

As Jan Richardson shared, "Fill your lungs with the air this new morning brings and then release it with a cry." Breakforth in celebration of the Risen Lord who was given to take all our sin, all our loss, all our grief that we would be able to rejoice in all that we experience in life but then also know God is there in all our struggles. Really, this is the journey of Lent. The reminder of what was lost that makes us new. Easter Blessings, Friends of St. John's!

Greetings Members and Friends of St. John's,

Resurrection is a capitalized word first used in the 14th century denoting Christ's rising from the dead to save God's people from sin as God had promised. Later, the word acquired a second meaning in a non-capitalized version which means renewal or rebirth: a fitting description of spring. Nature's winter and our Lenten winter, spring showers and our tears at Christ's suffering and death on the cross will pass. Spring flowers and Easter lilies will appear along with singing and rejoicing at Jesus's Resurrection and our salvation. It is so right that Easter and its wonderful gifts is celebrated in the spring as God renews his promises to us and his earth. A Resurrection and a resurrection. Thank you, God, for your bountiful blessings and for your most precious gift, your Son.

Here's the first Fun Fact: St. John's Congregation was established August 5, 1873, and worshiped in homes, then in the school and, finally, in the little white church built in 1889.

And then there's those Easter eggs. From the Encyclopaedia Britannica:

The tradition of dyeing and decorating Easter eggs is ancient, and its origin is obscure, but it has been practiced in both the Eastern Orthodox and the Western churches since the Middle Ages. The church prohibited the eating of eggs during Holy Week, but chickens continued to lay eggs during that week, and the notion of specially identifying those as Holy Week eggs brought about their decoration. The egg itself became a symbol of the Resurrection. Just as Jesus rose from the tomb, the egg symbolized new life emerging from the eggshell. In the Orthodox tradition, eggs are painted red to symbolize the blood that Jesus shed on the cross. The egg-coloring tradition has continued even in modern secular nations.



Anyone aged 60 or older wanting foot care (including nail trimming and evaluation of foot health) is eligible.

The suggested donation for foot care is \$20.

important ministry. A Stock Box is a free box of
healthy food for people age 60+ who have a monthly
income of \$1,473 or less per month (\$1,984 for a twoperson household).

All Stock Boxes include cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 pounds of fresh Wisconsin cheese and are available to pick up here at St. John's.





We will be discussing the book, The Sweetness of Forgetting by Kristin Harmel.

At thirty-six, Hope McKenna-Smith is no stranger to bad news. She lost her mother to cancer, her husband left her, and her bank account is nearly depleted. Her own dreams of becoming a lawyer long gone, she's running a failing family bakery on Cape Cod and raising a troubled preteen.

Now, Hope's beloved French-born grandmother Mamie is drifting away in a haze of Alzheimer's. But in a rare moment of clarity, Mamie realizes that unless she tells Hope about the past, the secrets she has held on to for so many years will soon be lost forever. Tantalizingly, she reveals mysterious snippets of a tragic history in WWII Paris. Armed with a scrawled list of names, Hope heads to France to uncover a seventy-year-old mystery.

What follows is "an immersive and evocative tale of generations struggling to survive" (Publishers Weekly) as Hope pieces together her grandmother's past bit by bit. Uncovering horrific tales of the Holocaust, she realizes the astonishing will of her grandmother to endure in a world gone mad. And to reunite two lovers torn apart by terror, all she'll need is a dash of courage, and the belief that God exists everywhere, even in cake.
