When thinking about the act of worship and community embedded in the Hope and Mercy of the Holy Spirit, one word comes to my mind to describe the experience and that is, "Transformative." I remind everyone that WORSHIP is THE central activity of our faith community. Everything we say and do as a church is inspired and birthed from God's Call for us to the Act of Worship. During our week, God is always with us, but it is during worship that we put ourselves in the position to be encountered by the person of Jesus Christ in the act of worship.


