### Grandma E's Mandarin Orange Bars

Bars: 2 cups sugar 2 eggs 2-15 oz cans of mandarin oranges. Drain the juice from one can. I like to use the "no sugar added" oranges. 2 1/8 cups flour 2 teaspoons baking soda 1 teaspoon salt Mix all ingredients together and pour into well sprayed/greased 9x15 jelly roll pan

Bake 30-35 minutes in preheated 350 degrees oven, center rack

(This recipe can be adapted for a 9x13 pan, need to add 2 ¼ cups of flour instead of 2 1/8 cups. Be sure to bake until golden brown as center takes longer: 35-40 minutes)

Frosting: Softened 8 ounces cream cheese 4 tablespoons softened butter 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>- 3 cups confectioners sugar Add milk (about a tablespoon) to desired consistency of frosting






In honor of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of St. John's, our noisy offerings were able to support numerous ministries across the globe!

It is a novel for everyone, a novel for a lifetime.




