#### Allegiance and Independence

As a Pastor, I am called to preach and teach God's word so when patriotic holidays roll around, I sometimes struggle with singing patriotic songs and having flags in our sanctuary because our allegiance is to God. The struggle is that I am a patriotic member of this earthly kingdom as well, having had family members who served, friends who have served and died for our freedoms, and I was also a military wife. I struggle because our theology affirms "we are to Love God with all our heart, all our soul and all our mind." First Commandment: We are to fear, love, and trust God above all things. In Luther's Small Catechism, we are not even offered a "What does this mean?" explanation as the other 9 commandments offer. This is sure and true!

While we do not do this, did you know that there are Pastors who refuse to allow flags in the sanctuary or who will not sing "patriotic" songs in worship? The Bible does not say we cannot do these things in worship, but it also does not say we shouldn't mud wrestle in the sanctuary. Which leads me to a reminder of why we come to worship. We gather to confess and receive and hear God's forgiveness, hear God's word, call upon God in prayer and praise (in word and song) and receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ in the fellowship of the communion of saints.

Each year it would behoove of us to reread the Declaration of Independence to be reminded of why our forefathers gathered and what those early patriots were able to accomplish in the idea of freedom for all. As we watch wars rage on across the seas, where atrocities are happening to innocent people, medical crises, and starvation, we need to be reminded of the freedoms that have been taken away from those people.

These patriotic holidays are an opportunity to realign our priorities. I feel like when we celebrate Lent and Advent, we talk a lot about remembering who our strength is, who is our path, who gives us direction in life, and who we are to always turn to, so I am taking this secular holiday to do that again. Founders of the United States pledged their lives, fortunes and their sacred honor, what would we pledge? And probably the toughest question is: Would we make that same kind of sacrifice for God? We pledge our allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, but do we first and foremost pledge allegiance to the God who gave his only Son so that we may have life eternal? It is fine to pray for the country and the military. It is essential to remember that our primary loyalty must be to the kingdom of God.

Independence Day also affords us the opportunity to reflect on our individual chains and the chains we put upon one another, knowingly or unknowingly. What is keeping us and our neighbors from the freedom we have been given in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ? Because our God first loved us, we have a freedom like no other. We are free to be the people of God and free to love our neighbors as ourselves and essentially, if you really think about it, that is why we celebrate Independence Day.

I pray you always remember that you are free every day because you are a beloved child of God who will not forget you nor will God forsake you. I pray you have a safe and wonderful summer with family and friends and remind you that we have so many wonderful things happening at St. John's and an exciting fall to look forward to as well.

#### Greetings!




