Gather Grow Go





Dear Ones of St. John's-

Matthew 25:14-29 is Jesus' parable of the talents. It's a significant parable about investments. A rich man delegates the management of his wealth to his servants, much as investors in today's markets do. He gives five talents (a large unit of money) to the first servant, two talents to the second, and one talent to the third. Two of the servants earn 100 percent returns by trading with the funds, but the third servant hides the money in the ground and earns nothing. The rich man returns, rewards the two who made money, but severely punishes the servant who did nothing.

The meaning of the parable extends far beyond financial investments. God has given each of us a wide variety of gifts, and God expects us to employ those gifts in God's service. It is not acceptable merely to put those gifts on a closet shelf and ignore them. Like the three servants, we do not have gifts of the same degree. The return God expects of us is commensurate with the gifts we have been given. The servant who received one talent was not condemned for failing to reach the five-talent goal; he was condemned because he did nothing with what he was given. The gifts we receive from God include skills, abilities, family connections, education, experiences, and more (Isa 28:24-26, Romans 12:6-8, 1 Cor. 12:7-10). The point of the parable is that we are to use whatever we have been given for God's purposes. This parable tells us that we are to invest our lives, not waste them. This is part of the stewardship we are called to as disciples of Christ.

Beginning this month, you will see that our "announcements" will be shared in our worship service. In our Offertory, we will share the announcements of our church life. This is an expression of our gifts to God as we are called to service. The catch is, you will need to be a bit of a planner. *Announcements that you would like included in the service need to be in the office by Wednesdays so we can plan accordingly for that part of the worship service.* And yes, our announcements are part of our worship to God, and we are also giving thanks for the work we are called into in Christ's name. Also, you will need to approach the lectern or use the wireless microphone for your announcement as those watching our service online may feel called to respond to the different things we are sharing.

Stewardship is about utilizing and managing all resources God has provided us and in turn we use them for the betterment of humanity and God's creation, to God's glory. Stewardship is more than our financial gifts God has provided but also our spiritual gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit: "to each is given the manifestation of the spirit for the common good." 1 Cor. 12:7

I look forward to watching as the community of St. John's listens to the call of the Spirit to the varied activities we have coming up in the church, and how you will step up to share all the God-given gifts you have received.

More to come on all of this soon! In the meantime, my question to you is: If you had to come up with 4 core values for St. John's, what would they be?

The virtual workshop, facilitated by Jim Ladoux of Vibrant Faith, was offered to us as part of the Living Well Leading Well project that Pastor Stacy is participating in. The 2 hours flew past as Jim shared ideas, insights, and challenged us to get to a place where, as a council and congregation, we are planning for at least a year out instead of focusing on the next 45-90 days. Jim talked about having a growth mindset, a willingness to try new or different ways of doing things. When we have a growth mindset, we are willing to take risk and accept that even if we fail, we will have learned from the experience.

While I could go on about this for several more paragraphs (or pages), I've got 11 months ahead to do so. \bigcirc




