Greetings!

When I left my house the morning of our annual meeting, I was a bit uneasy – not about getting up in front of everyone – that doesn't bother me at all – but about the information I was going to share regarding our finances and the plans for a capital campaign for the HVAC project. What I did not expect was to leave the meeting hopeful and excited. Then, the next Sunday I was stunned to discover we'd already received pledges of \$25K and had cash-in-hand of \$20K. A week later, and we have \$30K pledged! I am in awe of the love, faith, and generosity that abounds in all of you.

During this same 2 week period, I had the pleasure of meeting with our new council, first during our February meeting and then on February 15th for a council retreat. The retreat, facilitated by Vibrant Faith coach Jim LaDoux, was enlightening and challenged us to think about the things we are currently doing and how they fit within what we see as the future vision of St. John's. Take our worship service, for example. For those that grew up in the Lutheran church it's comfortable, it's what you expect it to be. Now, think about it from the experience of the first time visitor, particularly if that visitor didn't grow up in the Lutheran church. Is it welcoming and comfortable for them? In doing what we've always done, are we making our service as user-friendly and accessible to those we want to welcome into our congregation?

If you haven't figured out where I'm going with this yet, here it is: We are going to try some new things. Some you will love, some you will loathe, but we won't know what works for us if we don't try! And whether you love it or loathe it, we want – we need - your feedback. Yes, this means things are going to get a little uncomfortable, but we are faithful and strong; we can get through this if we all work together.

If you have ideas you'd like to share, new things you'd like St. John's to try, or thoughts about what I have shared, do not hesitate to reach out to me, Pastor Stacy, or any member of council.

Support St. John's Capital Fund Drive for HVAC Needs

Last fall, the Buildings and Grounds team confirmed that the compressor in the rooftop HVAC unit that cools the sanctuary was no longer functioning. As the unit has outlived its 15–20-year life expectancy, the decision was made to replace it. The cost of the replacement is \$40,000.

To fund this project, St. John's is holding a capital campaign for HVAC needs. Pledges are being accepted now through March 12, 2025, and must be paid in full by February 28, 2026. Replacement of the unit will not begin until St. John's has the funds in-hand to cover the cost of the project.

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is hard to believe we are coming upon another Lent season in just a week. I don't know which season I appreciate more, the contemplative reflection of Lent or Advent. Each season emphasizes reflection, repentance, and self-examination, calling for a deeper spiritual focus. Advent invites a hopeful waiting for the coming of Christ, while Lent invites a more penitent waiting, often marked by fasting and prayer as well as a deeper relationship with Jesus. Both seasons offer opportunities to reflect on one's relationship with God, to renew faith, and to await with expectation in the transformative power of Christ's coming. The beauty is we are always being transformed by Christ. The Church is always being transformed into something new, if we are open to the work of the Holy Spirit in us and in our communities.

As our council president, Sara Beth Holman pointed out, when there is change, sometimes we love it and sometimes we loathe it. The change the Holy Spirit moves us to is to offer us something better! Something better for our neighbors and something better for and in us. In the book of Luke, Jesus invites fishermen to be fisher of people. Andrew, James, and John, the first disciples to be called, likely had a moment of doubt stepping away from what was familiar to them. I know my call to ministry called me to step out of my comfort zone in many ways and still does.

The call to be a part of the body of Christ WILL change us. It will call us to step out of our comfort zone which means reaching out to those we don't know. Jesus' call to us will transform us and our lives, individually and collectively. Make no mistake, I understand there is grief in change, and I grieve with you. I have seen great changes in church over my lifetime. I grieve what has been, just like when we lose our loved ones and friends to a death or a relationship ends, but my faith gives me hope for what is to come and reminds me death does not have the last word, new life does.

As we enter the Lent season, I encourage you to reflect on what is going on around you. Slow down and listen to God's still voice speaking to you. People have struggled all the way back to creation and have mourned what was, but God always moved them forward into something new and often something uncomfortable. When Moses took the Israelites out of Egypt, there's no doubt they had anxiety not knowing what was to come, but God went with them.

Trying something new, for the sake of our neighbors, in a community we are comfortable in, takes great courage and I see that courage in this community of faith and our vision for St. John calls us to do just that. The beauty of the steps we take forward is that we do not take them alone. God is calling us into something new and God will be with us.

In this Lent season, I invite you to reflect and dream about what God is calling St. John community of faith into. I ask you to pray for the leadership of this congregation and for one another as siblings in Christ, that we would be open to the Spirit's work in us. Take the time to self-reflect on how you can be stepping out in a new way in the life of St. John and for the sake of the good news of Jesus in the world.

When we step outside our comfort zone, when we take the time to be in a deeper relationship with God and see Jesus in our siblings in this community of faith, and beyond the walls of St. John, we will be and are transformed as the people of God.






