But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen! Luke 24:1-5 NRSV

My orchid is blooming!

I have an orchid that I purchased in 2019 when I was preparing for Easter worship. At that time, the orchid had about three blooms on it and then it went dormant. Now this is not something unusual for orchids to do. It's no wonder since it is not native to our area nor does it like the midwest weather, especially in the cooler seasons.

When I moved to Green Bay in the summer of 2021, I would leave the plant out on my stoop so it could enjoy the beautiful sunshine and sometimes the humid weather. Suddenly, I saw new leaves shoot out and reach toward the sun. Eagerly, I watched and waited for new blooms to follow but no such luck. The orchid enjoyed last summer's weather but there was no new growth.



Lo and behold, in March a few buds popped up and FINALLY one new bloom! I had to take a picture! Note the backdrop of the snow that was still on the ground. I have a couple of wonderings. Why did this beautiful plant stay dormant so long and why did it finally bloom in the bleak winter with, really, no warm sun as orchids are accustomed to?

My thought is, this plant is a living thing and it sensed I was not thriving at that time in my life especially as I walked with my sister through cancer. It's been 7 months, almost to the day since she left this earth. The grief is still there, but each day is a little better. I am also stronger and happier than I have ever been. Maybe it was reminding me that time in the tomb is necessary. Maybe that bloom is a reminder that those who we lose are not gone as we sometimes feel, and that hope is a gift we all need, so badly. And I know we all have those people.

This entire month of May is Easter! Yes friends, Easter is more than just one day! The rejuvenation of the earth helps us remember that resurrection is God's intention for all of us as an ongoing part of creation. Resurrection is not just a hope for the future! New growth, new life, and springing forth can't help but show us how God can make something living out of something that appeared to be dead.

As we focus this month on caring for the Earth and being good stewards of all God has given us, I pray that we remember that we are part of that ongoing

creation and we need to care for ourselves, just as we care for each other and as I care for my orchid, even in what appears to be its "lifeless" state.

Maybe you feel like you're the one sitting out by the compost bin, not feeling much life. You are not forgotten and the good news is resurrection is for you! God will use you as you are transformed into something new. Maybe you are the one to pull someone back from the edge, filled with God's love and care.

So here is my orchid. An orchid of Resurrection (as another bud is starting to appear)! A reminder that God is with us, even when we feel like we do not have life within us or there is no life around us. We are transformed because of God's love and the Good News of Christ's Resurrection. Thanks be to God!

St. John's Lutheran Church Quarterly Informational Meeting Minutes April 23, 2023

Meeting called to order at 10:03 am by council president, Betty Stevens. Betty and Pastor Stacy presented recent happenings within the church as well as some of the upcoming activities planned for 2023:

I. **LYO is looking for help in donations towards Oconto County Humane Society.** Please place any monetary donations in the little church in the narthex.

II. **St. John's will be celebrating its 150th anniversary this year!** This day event will take place in September or October (pending the Packers schedule). If you would like to help on the planning committee, see Pastor Stacy. A German meal is being planned as our church founders were of German descent. Historical "FunFacts" will be in Sunday bulletins and monthly newsletters with trivia and prizes! An area of the narthex will be set up for you to view historical information/photos of our church. If you or someone you know has any information about the church, you are encouraged to share.

III. **Community service project:** Nikky Urbaniak, teacher and Sunday school leader, requested our support and was approved by council to make St. John's the "hub" to promote and distribute books monthly for our town's children, ages newborn until 5, through **Dolly Parton's Imagination Library**. Participants will need to sign up their children and mailing costs will be provided by the church. The program benefits utilizing St. John's tax exempt status to help control costs to the community. The costs have no connection to the church budget.

IV. **Council approved to put \$50,000 into a 7 month, 4.7% CD**. Other money will be decided by council to be allocated towards endowment funds that will benefit the church and synod. This is money in an account that is sitting and presently earning nothing.

V. **Future Service activities** include a number of baptisms and two weddings this year and another wedding next year.

VI. **BOOYAH!!** Served next week Sunday after church service. Brotherhood is requesting vegetables cutters/ preps Saturday morning at 8:00 am.

VII. **Auction committee** had first meeting today and next meeting is Sunday, May 21st, 7:30 am. See Tracey Krumrei or Pastor Stacy if you want to help with preparing for our biggest yearly event!

VIII. Ladies Tea Party set for Saturday, May 6h . Sign up is in the narthex. (Request to be added).



Anyone aged 60 or older wanting foot care (including nail trimming and evaluation of foot health) is eligible.

The suggested donation for foot care is \$20.

Oconto County Commission on Aging Senior Stock Box Program



As part of the Hunger Task Force and Commodity Supplemental Food Program, St. John's is proud to partner with OCCOA in this important ministry. A Stock Box is a free box of healthy food for people age 60+ who have a monthly income of \$1,473 or less per month (\$1,984 for a twoperson household).

All Stock Boxes include cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 pounds of fresh Wisconsin cheese and are available to pick up here at St. John's.





We will be discussing the book, <u>Murder in the Park by</u> Jeanne M. Dams.

Introducing spirited female sleuth Elizabeth Fairchild in the first of the brilliant new Oak Park village mystery series, set in 1920s Illinois.

June, 1925. Having been widowed in the First World War, Elizabeth Fairchild lives a quiet life at the home of her wealthy parents in genteel Oak Park village, Illinois. Although she does her best to avoid emotional entanglements, determined never to be

hurt again, Elizabeth forms a dose friendship with gentle Mr. Anthony, who owns the local antiques store. But tragedy strikes when Mr. Anthony is found stabbed to death in the alley behind his shop. Why would anyone murder a mild-mannered antiques dealer who simply loved beautiful things? A robbery gone wrong? A gangland execution? Or could it have something to do with the mysterious customer who bought a gold pocket watch from Mr. Anthony on the day he died?

When one of her father's oldest friends is accused of the crime, Elizabeth determines to expose the real killer. But her investigations soon attract unwelcome attention. 

Cranberry Nut Cinnamon Chex Mix

1 box Chex cereal 1 cup walnuts 1/4 cup packed brown sugar 1/4 cup frozen orange juice concentrate 2 tablespoons vegetable oil 1 cup sweetened dried cranberries

In a large microwave safe bowl, mix cereal and walnuts. In a 2 cup microwavable cup or bowl, microwave brown sugar, orange juice and veg oil for 1 minute, stir and microwave for 30 seconds. Microwave 30 seconds again and stir. Pour over cereal mixture stirring until evenly coated. Microwave for 2 minutes , stir, microwave for 2 more minutes, stir, and microwave 1 minute. Spread in wax paper or foil to cook and store in a covered container.

Country Apple Dessert

1 package yellow cake mix 1/3 cup butter, softened 1 egg 20 oz can apple pie filling 1/2 cup packed brown sugar 1 cup mixed nuts 1 teaspoon cinnamon 1 cup sour cream 1 egg 1 teaspoon vanilla

In a large bowl, combine cake mix, butter and 1 egg on low speed until crumbly. Press into ungreased 13x9 pan Spread pie filling over above. Combine brown sugar, nuts and cinnamon. Sprinkle over the apple layer. In a small bowl, blend sour cream, egg and vanilla. Pour over and spread on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 to 50 minutes or until the topping is golden. Serve warm or cold. Refrigerate leftovers.
