

Gather, Give, Grow and Go with God!



Last month Rostered and Lay Leaders of our synod gathered for our Fall Theological Conference. We were blessed with time for fellowship and learning. This year we welcomed Rev. Tim Brown, Director for Stewardship of the ELCA. He reminded us that everything we do is *Stewardship*. But friends, we have to understand what stewardship means. The book of Luke uses the Greek word *oikonomos* which means steward or manager of a household and *oikonomia* meaning stewardship.

So, what do we steward? We steward: our voices, relationships, land, body, creation, time, and I'm sure you can think of a couple others. The point is, we are called to Steward EVERYTHING. We seem to think stewardship is only about money but it's really about what comes after when we say "I believe". Jesus calls us to love and not only ourselves but our neighbors. I don't believe there is any one who says, in faith, I believe my neighbor should go hungry, I believe my neighbor shouldn't have a roof over their heads, I believe my neighbor should be overlooked because of the color of their skin...



Our faith believes we are equal to one another, that we see Jesus' face in each other's face. Jesus gives us so many examples of how to steward all the things we have been given. If we love Jesus then we will live in a mindset of abundance and share what we have been given in our voice for the oppressed, in our relationships reaching out to one another to have an honest conversation, in our time that we offer to learn about who God is in the world and worship and praise and volunteering, in our stewardship of creation. Our giving is part of our call to discipleship.

Stewardship should flow from our mission we state every Sunday, **Gather, Give, Grow and Go with God!** We **gather** to hear the good news of Jesus. We learn to **give** of the gifts God first gave us, we **grow** by hearing the word of God and learning how we have been called to be disciples in the world and are sent out to go with God. Each one of us are stewards. Each one of us needs to reflect on how we manage our households and we should reflect in this way not only once a year but every month. **How is God calling you to steward your gifts?**

We have much to be thankful for! As we continue in uncertain times, we can be certain of the one who died on the cross. We can be certain of our call in the world to love our neighbors as ourselves. We can be certain that God has provided enough in this world for all God's people. As we look forward to Thanksgiving, I will be giving thanks for all of God's stewards and what and how they share with their neighbors. Be the hands and feet of Christ to those who are struggling and remember we have been called as disciples to be good stewards of all the gifts we are given.

The God Who Is Always There

Parents and grandparents, please paraphrase and modify to meet the age-appropriate needs, attitudes, and safety concerns of your family. Younger children can watch parents enjoying this activity to model healthy family life.

What you'll need: salt, paper plate, pepper and a plastic spoon

- #1 Pour salt in a small pile on a paper plate.
- #2 Say something like, "This salt represents Jesus in our lives."
- #3 Lightly sprinkle pepper over the salt. Say something like, "The pepper represents people in our lives."
- #4 Rub the back of the spoon vigorously on some part of your clothing to build up static electricity. Hold it over the salt. The pepper will be attracted by the static electricity and cling to the spoon.
- #5 Say something like, "Even though people leave us, like the pepper left the salt, God will never desert us. Jesus wants to always be in our lives."

- Why do you think it is good to have friends who care about us?
- How can our friends and acquaintances sometimes be like the pepper?
- How is Jesus like the salt?
- Why do you think it is important to keep our eyes on Jesus? (See Hebrews 12:2-3)



Note to parents/grandparents: Younger children will enjoy this activity even though they won't fully understand it. What they will understand is that you believe faith in Christ is important!



Home-Canned Items Needed For Fall Bazaar

The canning season is here, which means the bazaar is not that far away! The Canned Goods area is a popular stop for the Bazaar shoppers. Needed canned goods are jams, jellies, pickles, fruit sauces, salsa and anything else that can be canned safely. When you're canning, if you can set aside a dozen (or more!) for the Bazaar, it would be appreciated.


Between 50-60 dozen are needed.

To keep the product consistent and safe, here are a few guidelines:

- Use standard canning jars: 8 oz. for jams and jellies, pint and quart for pickles, etc. (brand unimportant).
- Seal with ring/lid (brand unimportant).
- Jars should be filled, i.e., no gap from top of product to bottom of ring.
- Jams, jellies, preserves, etc. should be soft set (jiggles like Jello) or firm set (no jiggle). That pesky batch that didn't set can always be sold as a topping!

For product safety use FDA water bath processing guidelines.

The Bazaar canners recycle: empty jars and rings in good condition can be used over and over and help keep costs down. Bring them to church during August and September and the canners will fill them up again.


